Councillors reporting Play Areas:	Identified that WCC installed Steel tubing fence instead of the Steel rod fence installed elsewhere in the fencing. Straight replacement will not resolve the problem. Recommend we raise this with WCC as they installed the fence in the first place. The Waste Bin at the bridge was removed by the contractors who installed the crossing and has not been replaced. This was discussed at the meeting with WCC /SDC. No progress to report. Report from external inspection raised concerns over the metal bridge access to the Skate park This is being discussed with the school and WCC at the moment. Letter sent to the Secondary School requesting an urgent meeting as there is continuing further deterioration on the deck of the bridge. Working with the Hub to get a resolution. Recommend that the bridge is closed for emergency repairs and an alternative access is made over the small JPC bridge into Littleworth Field and the removal of a section of fence into the Skatepark.
